Foster animal limits per household

Please note this is a guide and each time will depend on each individual animal and home. The operations team will assess each case.

In Victoria foster carers are permitted to have 5 cats and dogs per household, however we know that a lot of animals will thrive being solo and for their wellness, less animals is better quality of life.

Cats per household

Bedrooms	Maximum cats
Studio	2
1 Bedroom	3
2 Bedroom	4
3 Bedroom +	5

Regardless of the house, we will make assessments based on each individual animal. All cats must have a safe space alone just for themselves where they eat and a high place to sit and climb.

A good rule of thumb is 2 meters squared for each cat.

The animal coordinator will assess each case individually if it does not fall into the above depending on the animal.

Dogs per household

Dogs will depend on the individual dog getting along and the space of the yard as we can separate spaces like with cats.

Unless it is a very large property it would not be recommended to have more than 4 dogs at once.

The animal coordinator will assess each case individually.
